

## Core Upset Recovery Concepts for Professional Jet Pilots

You are about to begin a thoroughly rewarding and comprehensive presentation of upset recovery concepts. Although navigation is explained in the course introduction, any trouble you may experience navigating (or getting to the next page) is likely explained here.

### NAVIGATING THE COURSE

#### Moving to the Next Page:

Several pages in this course require the user to click on one or more icons, links or images to permit navigation to the next page. Once you have viewed the required link or pop-up, you will not need to click it again if you decide to review the page later. This functionality is by design to ensure special emphasis is given to important information, author explanations or other subject matter crucial to your education in upset recovery training and helpful to you when taking the course quiz. Course navigation has been rigorously tested. If you cannot move forward, there is an important link or pop-up window you have not yet reviewed on the page. Here are a few examples to look for:



All **Important Note** icons are **mandatory** and unique to the page being viewed. When present, this icon will appear at the bottom left corner of the page and **MUST BE VIEWED** to move forward in the course. Information critical to passing the final quiz is often included in the **Important Note** pop-up windows.

#### Link Text

Some links are **mandatory** in the course and will usually be identified by an annotation such as "Click Here", "View this Link" or "Click on the Image/Chart". Viewing ALL links is strongly recommended.

#### Images/Charts

Some images and charts are **mandatory**. When mandatory, they will be referenced in the text of the course.

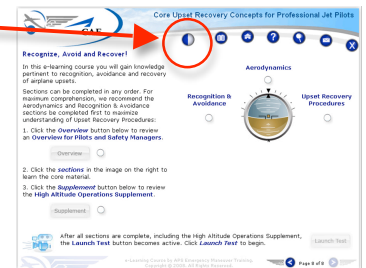
#### Returning to the Completion Status Page:

There are only two icons in the upper navigation bar that will move you within the course. Most of the time, you will be using the **Completion Status** icon as shown below repeatedly to return to the main navigation hub to select various course sections and topics.



Completion Status

This is the icon on the upper navigation bar you will use most of the time once you complete the course introduction. Clicking this icon will return you to the **Completion Status** page to see the various sections and topics of the course along with their current completion status. This page (shown to the right) is your main navigation hub. Topic status is indicated by checkmarks. Section status is indicated by circles. Circles can be empty, half full or full. A full circle on the **Completion Status** page indicates that section has been completed.



Home Page

**ONLY** click the **Home Page** icon if you want to return to the beginning of the entire course and review the introduction sequence. If you click the **Home Page** icon, you will need to review all the introduction pages before getting to the **Completion Status** page. **NOTE: the Completion Status icon is not active in the introduction.**

#### Audio:

The course audio provides an overview of each page and **does not** read the text on the page word for word. Audio is optional and **does not** include information that isn't already provided in the text.
